- ✓ Help countries define strategies and make informed decisions in their asset recovery programs
- ✓ Deliver gap analysis, capacity building and training
- ✓ Facilitate coordination/dialogue between states parties through all forms of international cooperation, inc Mutual Legal Assistance
- ✓ Support the preparation and analysis of information on asset recovery aspects of specific cases
- ➤ Be involved in litigation or criminal proceedings
- **✗** Finance legal representation
- Manage cases or make decisions on the conduct of cases

### Asset Recovery as a fundamental principle of international law

- UNCAC: Chapter V- The return of assets is a fundamental principle of this Convention, and States Parties shall afford one another the widest measure of cooperation and assistance in this regard.
- Establishes a principle, but leaves a lot open for implementation.

### Recovery


- Various legal resource/procedures are available to recover victim's assets and funds from perpetrators, both through criminal and civil procedures.

#### Barriers to Asset Recovery: General/Institutional barriers

#### **★ Lack of trust**

+ Promote personal contacts between relevant officials (liaison magistrates, police attachés...), attend international events, participate in international networks.

### **★ Lack of comprehensive AR policy**

- → Make Asset Recovery of policy priority
- + Ensure legislation supports asset recovery

+ Create specialized investigative units to focus on stolen assets

#### **★ Deficient resources**

+ Commit resources, develop capacity and expertise, communicate about sharing of costs and recovered assets

### Barriers to Asset Recovery: Legal barriers

#### **★ No quick freeze or restraint**

→ Introduce mechanism allowing for prompt tracing and temporary freezing of assets before forma MLA is filed

#### **★ Unbalanced notice requirements**

+ Permit MLA without notifying asset holders where investigative and preservation measures are involved

### **★ Lack of "equivalent Value"** confiscation

### **★ Lack of Non-Conviction Based** forfeiture mechanism

→ Introduce NCB forfeiture, at a minimum enforcement of foreign NCB orders

### Barriers to Asset Recovery: Operational barriers

#### \* Absent or ambiguous focal points

→ Identify primary and secondary focal points-provide clear and updated information on governmental websites.

## **★ Formalistic approach to dual criminality**

→ Use a conduct-based test to dual criminality, be clear and limitative in ground for refusal

## **★ Inability/unwillingness to deal with deficient requests**

→ Lend a helping hand to requesting countries (translation, technical assistance, MLA writer tool

### **★ Inability to identify foreign bank** accounts

+ Establish a national registry of bank accounts, and enable submission of such information upon MLA request

### Recommendations to overcome the barriers to asset recovery

- Adopt and Implement comprehensive Strategic Plans Targeting Stolen Asset Recovery and Provide Sufficient Resources and Training (Provide Practitioners the Framework and the Tools).
- Adopt Policies and Operational Procedures to Cultivate Mutual Trust and Improve Communication (Build Trusting Relationships).
- Introduce Legislative Reforms that support Authorities' Capacity to restrain and Confiscate Stolen Assets.
- Effectively Apply Anti-Money Laundering Measures.
- Provide a Sound Legal Basis for a Wide Range of Types of Mutual Legal Assistance (Where There is Political Will. There is a Legal Way).
- Allow for the rapid Tracing and Temporary of Seizing of Assets before Receiving a Formal MLA Request (Freeze, before Assets Disperse).
- Encourage, Pursue, and Maintain all Methods of Informal Assistance before initiation of a Formal MLA Request (First Step, Talk to Colleagues).
- Experienced Asset Recovery Jurisdictions Should Mentor and Train Practitioners in Less Experienced Jurisdictions (Lend a Helping Hand).
